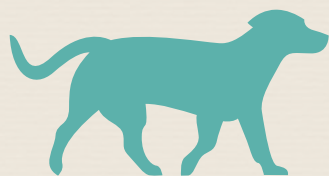

## Go Bag Inventory

Just as you do with your family's emergency supply kit, think first about the basics for survival, particularly food and water. Consider two kits. In one, put everything you and your pets will need to stay where you are. The other should be a lightweight, smaller version you can take with you if you and your pets have to get away. Plus, be sure to review your kits regularly to ensure that their contents, especially foods and medicines, are fresh.

\_\_\_\_\_ Food (at least 3 days worth in airtight container)

\_\_\_\_\_ Water (at least 3 days worth per pet)  
Consider a water filter to reduce exposure to water borne diseases.

\_\_\_\_\_ Medicines & copy of medical records

\_\_\_\_\_ First Aid kit specifically for pets

\_\_\_\_\_ Collar & ID tags, harness or leash

\_\_\_\_\_ Crate/carrier for each pet

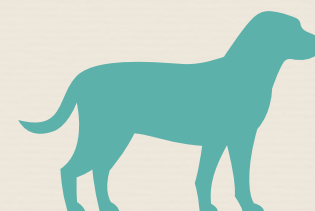

Tape or glue each end to secure

On the cover, glue a copy of a photo of yourself with your pet. This helps to provide proof of ownership in case of emergency. In the space below that picture, put the animal's name, then your name, address and contact phone number. On the last line, put the name, address and phone number of your primary veterinarian.

Your emergency contact information should be added on the second page, first panel. In the section below that, describe your animal. List medications/issues, provide the contact information for your microchip, and include the contact phone for the microchip company.

When you have completed the information, fold the form in 3 equal sections along the line indicated, and glue/tape the bottom and the top to create and secure the pocket. Note that the inside panel of the newly create pocket has a space for another picture of your animal.
